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Presidents Year-end report

It gives me great pleasure to address you with my end of the year report. Although quite challenging, I am proud to announce the achievements 2021 -22.

I would first like to thank my fellow Board members and all the committee members along with the volunteers that keep us moving forward. Their commitment is demonstrated in the quality of our community.

This past year has been focused on the preservation of the lake. The volunteers of the Lake Committee in conjunction with the members of the Board have implemented a plan to survey the lake and its health for the future. A contract between the Hidden Lake Association and Aquatic Ecosystem Research (AER) group has been entered into. The AER is conducting a complete study regarding the "Lose of Depth" due to muck along with a long overdue Bathymetric mapping. These reports will allow for the Lake Committee to move forward with any remedies needed. A long list of possibilities to the issue of muck has been explored and once the report from AER is complete the Committee can suggest the next step in the restoration.

The newly developed Aquatic Wildlife Committee has been instrumental in educated the Board as well as the Association Members of the precious Wildlife we live amongst. The Committee is dedicated to the health and wellbeing of these animals and birds along with the all-important vegetation both in the water and along its shores. Quarterly newsletters have been and will continue to be published and distributed with all the Committee findings

The grounds around our beach areas are now being maintained in the hopes of controlling the overgrowth we have encountered over the past years. Additional Lake blankets have been purchased and will be installed at the beaches in the very near future.

All of these achievements and more have proven to be a great asset to the value and to the attraction of our community. Let's all keep up the good work. Remember we are merely stewards of this lake and need to preserve it future generations.

HLA Lake Committee Annual Report 2022

Lake Committee Members:

Sheri Berger, Jay Cassella, Anthony Grandazzo, Victoria Nicholson, James Nicholson, David Chalifoux

Accomplishment Summary:

- 1. Completed water testing per bylaw recommendations
- 2. Installed the lake water gauge
- 3. Monitored Weed Control plan, bypassed the last treatment based on lake health
- 4. Installed Beach rope boarder
- 5. Beach signs are in work by the Lake Committee pending 2022 annual meeting vote (pending wording on dogs & authorized motor vehicles)
- 6. Evaluated and interviewed 3 lake management companies, SOLitude, Pond and Lake Connection, and Aquatic Ecosystem Research.
 - Potential strategies investigated: Nano bubbler diffuser; submerged aeration & bacteria augmentation, Oxygenation saturation technology, and suction dredging.
 - All approaches are very expensive, (in excess of \$75,000). Continued research regarding viability has shown most to be of questionable success (except for suction dredging) according to the CT Agricultural Experiment Station and the Aquatc Ecosystem Research company, with whom we have contacted.
 - The Pond and Lake Connection will be contracted through AER as a cost savings.
- 7. Down selected **Aquatic Ecosystem Research** (AER). Established a contract that covers: Muck depth, Bathymetric mapping and lake report.
- 8. Continued communication with Greg Bugbee, Associate Agricultural Scientist, Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station for technical advice.
- 9. Proposed Lake Committee budget

The By-Law Committee held a meeting on May 2, 2022 @ 7:00pm

Present at the meeting:, Cindi Porriello, Jean Cassella, James Nicholson, Bob Kiehm, and President Jay Cassella. Heather Edelson participate via conference call.

The committee reviewed the below listed by-laws:

Section 23 Vice President
Section 34 Signing of Checks
Section 42-B Pets on the Beaches
Section 5 Definitions - Vote
Section 51 Mobile Home

The committee discussed Section 23 and Section 34. By-law changes were submitted to a Special Meeting on June 28, 2021. These by-laws were amended by the association members present and approved. Other changes to these sections were reviewed and the decision not to forward these changes at this time.

There was also a review of section 1 of our charter in reference to proxy voting. An email from Alan Stokke concerning the language of this section was shared with the committee. Mr. Stokke had provided a Legislative Research opinion (reference report 2017-R-0252) about the use of Absentee Ballots by a Special Taxing District. After some discussion the committee conclude that absentee ballots are not permitted; however, proxy representation was permitted by our charter. A by-law change was proposed and adopted by the committee and was be forwarded to the President to be included for approval at the annual meeting.

A request was made by Dan Salafra for a by-law change to allow dogs on the beach during the off-swimming season. James Nicholson provided a draft of a suggested change. The committee discussed the issue using Legislative Research report (reference 2014-R-133), information from the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection's website and Connecticut State Statue {section 23-4-1(f)}. A by-law change was drafted and approved by the committee and forward to the President to be included for approval at the upcoming annual meeting.

The committee reviewed Section 51 Mobile Home and could not agree on the proper terminology. It was determined to table this subject.

- 1. Since Covid we've not been able to do any fund raising except for last year's tag sale. - 2. We started putting flowers in the barrels at the mailboxes and will finish it this week. I'm happy to state that the cement beach barrels have all been adopted by neighbors. Thank you, Leann and Dean for taking care of South Shore, Mary Beth and Jill for taking care of West Shore and to Mark for taking care of East Shore. Next up will be the Memorial Day Banners.
- 3. We have a balance left from last year of \$483.40 we would like to use that money to get the new wooden flower boxes built around the new entrance signs. We are looking for someone to help us with that.
- 4. Tag Sale will be held on July 23rdth at 109 East Shore. So please start cleaning out your garages and homes for items you can contribute to our sale. We will start taking items on the 15th or sooner if you need to get things out sooner. More information on this will follow.
- 5. Wine on the Water our biggest fund raiser will return this year after a two-year hiatus. I've already begun speaking to potential sponsors and I'm looking a venue. If I can't find anything local it will be at our house

- once again if I can get a large tent donated or at a discounted price. We are looking at a possible date of September 10th.
- 6. I talked to the town zoning agent to see what we can do about abandoned vehicles. We must follow the same regulations as the Town of Haddam which is not a problem. I spoke with some of the salvage yards in the area and they are willing to pay the owners cash for the metal and scrap value if the owner of the vehicle is interested and would like to have it removed. I see this as a first step to cleaning up our neighborhoods if anyone is interested.
- 7. I also am concerned about all the piles of leaves that have been sitting next to our roads for years. So, I asked him, he said he was too busy.
